




Deeside Gardens – proposed lengths of prohibition of waiting at any time

There have been ongoing concerns expressed by residents over incidents of obstructive parking on Deeside Gardens. When considering the Deeside Drive area, the Council have introduced two batches of restrictions to certain lengths of road in the past few years, these being relevant to issues of visitors / commuters parking indiscriminately, the sources of these vehicles being suggested as Robert Gordon University (displacement associated with Garthdee Controlled Parking Zone), St Francis of Assisi Church, and visitors accessing the Deeside Way.

The usual course of action would be to report isolated incidences of vehicular obstruction to Police Scotland, however, after a period of investigation, it has been found there is a pattern of regularity to the latest issues on Deeside Gardens and it would now be appropriate to promote certain lengths of prohibition of waiting at any time to manage parking on a limited section of Deeside Gardens, with the City Wardens Service able to provide enforcement action should the restrictions be contravened.

Implementation Costs – £500 Estimated maintenance costs – £500 every 5 years


Hopecroft development – proposed new speed limits


Linksfield Road – proposed 20mph zone (also relevant to the Tillydrone / Seaton / Old Aberdeen ward)

Some years ago, a 20mph zone was installed on Linksfield Road. This scheme included signs and speed cushions, to encourage drivers to adhere to a 20mph speed limit on a long, wide, straight road. Unfortunately, from an administrative perspective a formal Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) cannot be traced for the intervention. Thus, while the intervention is self-enforcing in the context of physical traffic calming 'road humps' that were established, it is proposed a formal TRO should be promoted to provide for a mandatory 20mph speed limit.

Environments where motor vehicles travel at speeds of less than 20mph are safer and more welcoming for those making journeys by active travel modes, such as walking and cycling. Many customers of the Aberdeen Sports Village on Linksfield Road, which include young families and students, arrive there by active travel modes. Linksfield Road is also residential. A 20mph zone is necessary in terms of road safety, to protect those making journeys by active travel and discourage antisocial driving speeds within a residential community.


Merkland Lane - proposed 20mph zone


Maidencraig development - proposed 20mph zone and waiting restrictions


The construction of the Maidencraig residential development is ongoing, with many properties now occupied. The developer proposes that roads branching off the main road through the development are subject to a mandatory 20mph speed limit. While similarly, the speed limit on the service road at Whitemyres Holdings (parallel to the Lang Stracht), from which the development can be accessed, is reduced from 30mph to 20mph. Maintenance: £5500 (including £4500 for traffic calming reinstatement) every 15 years








