ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

THE ABERDEEN CITY COUNCIL (QUEEN STREET, ABERDEEN) (POLICE PARKING BAY) ORDER 202(X)

Aberdeen City Council, in exercise of its powers under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as "The 1984 Act"), and in exercise of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Constable of Police Scotland in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, and having complied with the requirements of The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Procedure) (Scotland) Regulations 1999, hereby makes the following order:-

Citation

1. This order may be cited as "The Aberdeen City Council (Queen Street, Aberdeen) (Police Parking Bay) Order 202(X)" and shall come into operation on ____ 202__.

Police Parking Bay

2. Save as provided in Article 3 of this order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the length of Queen Street, on its north-west side, from a point 75 metres north-east of its junction with Broad Street, north-eastwards for a distance of 12 metres or thereby.
3. Nothing in Article 2 of this order shall apply to a police vehicle, meaning a vehicle used by Police Scotland in pursuance of duties carried out under the direction of the Chief Constable.

Revocation

4. Upon the coming into effect of this order, any provision of any other order, with the exception of the Grampian Regional Council (Heavy Vehicles) (Overnight Parking Places, Aberdeen) Order 1987, made or having effect as if made under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and existing at the time when this order comes into effect, that provided for a waiting restriction on any parts of the length of road specified in Article 2, is hereby revoked
